

Application for Admission to Undergraduate Study

Instructions

Please be sure to read all information and instructions carefully before completing your application.

Submitting your application

Completed application forms should be returned to the Office of University Admissions with a **non-refundable** application fee of \$50. Make your check or money order payable to New Jersey Institute of Technology. If you have access to the Internet, you may submit your application electronically via our web site:

www.njit.edu/admissions/apply-online.php

Academic Records

All academic records must be sent directly from the institution where courses were taken to the Office of University Admissions at NJIT, University Heights, Newark, NJ 07102-1982. Transcripts must bear the school seal. Unofficial transcripts are not acceptable.

Albert Dorman Honors College

Students with exceptional records of academic achievement may be eligible for admission to the Albert Dorman Honors College. Be sure to complete the honors application (Part VII) and submit to the honors college.

Educational Opportunity Program

New Jersey residents who meet certain financial and academic requirements may be eligible for admission through the Educational Opportunity Program (EOP). Be sure to complete Part IV.

Freshman Applicants

Candidates for admission to NJIT who have not attended a post-secondary school are considered freshman applicants. Be sure to complete Parts I, II (Section A), III, V and VI.

The required credentials for freshmen include:

- An official copy of the high school transcript
- An official SAT or ACT report

The application deadline for most programs is March 1. However, since admission to NJIT is selective, high school students are advised to file the application for admission early in their senior year. Applications received after the deadline will be considered on a space available basis.

The application deadline for all accelerated pre-medical and pre-dental programs is November 1. Please note that applicants to all accelerated programs must also apply to the Albert Dorman Honors College (Part VII).

Transfer Applicants

A student applying for admission as a transfer student is someone who has attended a college or university following graduation from high school. These applicants should complete Parts I, II (Section B), III, V and VI. In addition, transfer students must request that official transcripts be sent directly from each institution the student attended. Transcripts should be sent to the address indicated in "Academic Records" (above).

SAT scores and high school transcripts may be required of transfer students who have completed less than two full years (64 credits) of college level work.

The transfer application deadline for all programs for the fall semester is June 1. The application deadline for all programs for the spring semester is November 15. Those students who apply early can benefit from advance course selection, cooperative education/internship placement, and priority for financial aid.

Students who have attended foreign institutions of higher education must also submit an evaluation of their work from World Education Services, Inc. (www.wes.org) or another approved evaluation service. Academic departments reserve the right to make final decisions on the acceptance of foreign transfer credit.

Readmission Applicants

Students who have been officially accepted at NJIT, have attended classes and earned grades, and then have not attended NJIT for a period of at least 1 semester must apply for readmission. These applicants should complete Parts I, II (Section C), III, V, and VI.

The readmission application deadline for students in good academic standing is August 1 for the fall semester and November 15 for the spring semester. Deadline for students who have been academically suspended is July 1 for the fall and November 1 for the spring. Files not complete by the deadline will be withdrawn from consideration; at the applicant's written request, they may be updated to the following semester.

International Applicants

A person applying to NJIT as an international student is an individual who is neither a U.S. citizen nor a permanent resident. Due to the additional time necessary to evaluate international student credentials, it is recommended that students begin the application process at least six months prior to the beginning of the semester in which they wish to commence their studies. These applicants should complete Parts I, II (Section D), III, V, and VI.

The required credentials for international freshman applicants include:

- An official copy of secondary school transcripts
- Official score reports of any standardized examinations administered for proficiency and/or university admission in your country
- An affidavit of financial support with bank verification:

- An official SAT or ACT score report
- An official "Test of English as a Foreign Language" (TOEFL) score report (minimum 550 score for the paper-based test, 213 for the computer-based test, or 79 for the Internet-based test or official International English Language Testing System (IELTS) score report (minimum score of 6.0).
- A photocopy of the picture page of the applicant's passport

The required credentials for international transfer applicants include:

- An evaluation of the transcripts from World Education Services, Inc. (www.wes.org) or another approved evaluation service (www.naces.org/members.htm)
- An affidavit of financial support with bank verification
- An official "Test of English as a Foreign Language" (TOEFL) score report (minimum 550 score for the paper-based test, 213 for the computer-based test, or 79 for the Internet-based test or official International English Language Testing System (IELTS) score report (minimum score of 6.0).
- A photocopy of the picture page of the applicant's passport
- Although not required, it is recommended that students submit notarized copies of university transcripts.

- DMD** (Dental - Offered jointly by NJIT and the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey. Minimum 1250 SAT critical reading and math composite or minimum 28 ACT score required. Application deadline November 1.)
- OD** (Optometry - Offered jointly by NJIT and the SUNY-State College of Optometry. Minimum 1300 SAT critical reading and math composite or minimum 29 ACT score required. Application deadline November 1.)
- DPT** (Doctor of Physical Therapy - Offered jointly by NJIT and the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey. (Minimum 1250 critical reading and math SAT composite or minimum 29 ACT score required. Application deadline January 15.)
- JD** (Law - Offered jointly by NJIT and Seton Hall Law School. Minimum 1300 SAT critical reading and math composite or minimum 29 ACT score required. Application deadline January 15.)

All accelerated applicants (Except DPT) must have rank in class or GPA in top 10%, physical therapy applicants are top 15%.

Only the following majors are available in the accelerated programs:

For medicine, dentistry, physical therapy or optometry – Biology, Biomedical Engineering, Chemistry, Communication, Engineering Science, History, Mathematical Sciences, Applied Physics or Science, Technology and Society.

For law – Architecture, Biology, Biomedical Engineering, Chemistry, Communication, Engineering Science, Environmental Science, History, Information Technology/Criminal Justice, Management, Mathematical Sciences, or Science, Technology and Society.

Applicants to accelerated programs must submit an essay (see topic below) and **two** letters of recommendation, at least one of which **must** come from a teacher who specifically addresses your qualifications to be in the accelerated preprofessional program to which you are applying. The Honors College recommends to the professional schools only those whom it judges well qualified to succeed in an accelerated program based on the applicant’s total record. The accelerated programs are open only to U.S. citizens or permanent residents, except for the St. George’s program, which is open to all candidates.

Tell us why you want to be in an accelerated program in medicine/law/dentistry/optometry/physical therapy, and the academic, educational or other experiences you have had that provide a foundation for participating in this program. This essay replaces the Regular Essay for Freshman Applicants. *Please be sure to attach a clear printout of your essay with your application.*

Essay Topic for Transfer Applicants:

(including current NJIT students): Write an essay in which you give a specific and definite plan for your honors education at NJIT. Your essay **must** cover the following points: (1) Honors courses you have taken, and those **specifically** you plan to take; (2) research, internships, or similar projects you have completed, and those you would **specifically** like to participate in; (3) service and other activities within NJIT or your current undergraduate college, and **specifically** those you would like to continue or begin; and (4) whether you plan to enroll in a minor or second major. The essay should explain **specifically** how membership in the Honors College will help you to attain academic and professional excellence. **This essay is the most important part of your application.**

In addition to the essay, attach a separate sheet:

- List extracurricular, community, and service activities in which you have engaged.
- List any projects and research related to your curriculum in which you have engaged.
- List any Honors courses taken and grades achieved. Distinguish between those taken at NJIT and those taken elsewhere.

Normally only those who meet the following requirements are considered for transfer admission.

Current NJIT Freshman should complete at least one semester at NJIT prior to submitting the application.

- Full time students currently taking no Developmental courses such as Math 098, 103/104; Physics 105/106; Chemistry 121/122/123; or HSS 099/100.
- Have taken 12 or more credits each semester.
- Have a GPA of at least 3.4.
- If you have taken any Honors course, must have earned a B or better.
- Must have at least 4 semesters remaining to complete the current degree.
- Have taken part in university or community activities or research.

In short, we ask applicants to the Honors College to have achieved the same level of excellence as those currently in the program. If an applicant falls somewhat short of these requirements, he/she may be asked to spend one or two semesters demonstrating the capability to handle honors by taking honors courses, participating in service activities, and attending honors colloquia, before being fully admitted to Honors.
