COURSE REQUIREMENTS

All students must have completed a minimum of 16 secondary school units before beginning freshman studies.

- 4 units of English.
- 2 units of lab science (chemistry and physics preferred).
- 4 units of mathematics, including algebra, geometry and trigonometry.
- A combination of social studies, foreign language, math and science that equals 6 units.

ADMISSION SELECTION CRITERIA

High School grades and curriculum:

- When evaluating high school grades, we look at both overall GPA as well as individual course grades. In addition to good grades, we look for a challenging academic curriculum (honors and AP classes).

Standardized Test Scores:

- We take the best critical reading score and math score from all attempts at the SAT-I. The average combined SAT (CR + M) for the full-time freshman class in 2011 is 1140.

High School Activities, Honors and Recommendations:

- Although grades and test scores are the most significant tools in assessing a prospective student, involvement and leadership in high school activities can be beneficial to admission. Furthermore, activities and membership in Honor Societies are a major factor in admission for the Albert Dorman Honors College.
- While not required, letters of recommendation are welcome for all applicants.

Personal Interview:

- We encourage prospective students to schedule an appointment for an information session and a campus tour. Personal interviews are not required.

IMPORTANT DATES AND DEADLINES FOR FRESHMEN

Fall Admission:

March 1.....Deadline for submitting the application for admission. Students are urged to submit completed applications as early as possible, as NJIT utilizes rolling admissions.

May 1.....Deadline for submitting deposit for tuition and housing.

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA):

January 1.....Recommended filing deadline to receive need-based aid award.

March 15.....Final filing deadline for FAFSA.
