## 2. APPROVE MINUTES OF NOVEMBER 8, 2018 BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

#### NEW JERSEY INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY BOARD OF TRUSTEES MINUTES OF PUBLIC MEETING (November 8, 2018)

The meeting was called to order by Chair DePalma at 4:10 p.m. in Eberhardt Hall, NJIT Alumni Center Boardroom, NJIT Campus, Newark, N.J. In attendance were Chair DePalma, Vice Chairs DeCaprio and Raia, Board Members Bone, Cistaro, Dahms, Montalto, Poddar, Taylor and Toft. Absent: Vice Chairs Cohen, Garcia and Taylor.

Senior Administration Present: In attendance were President Bloom, Provost and Sr. Executive Vice President Deek, Sr. Vice President and Treasurer Bishof, Sr. Vice President Sebastian, Vice Presidents Alexo, Christ, Iyer, and Nynens, Dean Boger, Executive Director Golden and Vice President and Secretary Stern.

1. In accordance with the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, Chair DePalma read the following statement:

"Notice of this Meeting was provided to the public as required by the New Jersey Open Public Meeting Act, in the Schedule of Meeting Dates of the Board of Trustees of the New Jersey Institute of Technology which was mailed and sent electronically to the Star Ledger, the Herald News and the Vector on August 9, 2017, and posted on the University website. This Schedule was also mailed and sent electronically to the County Clerk on August 9, 2017 for filing with that office and posting in such public place as designated by said Clerk."

- 2. By a motion duly made by Mr. Cistaro, seconded by Ms. Montalto and unanimously approved, the Board approved the public minutes of the meeting of September 20, 2018, with abstentions from those members not in attendance at such meeting.
- 3. Provost Deek introduced the Board of Trustees Scholars 2018, whose statements appear in the Board materials. Mr. Samir Peshori addressed the Board. He is an Albert Dorman Honors College sophomore double majoring in Computer Science and Information Technology, and pursuing a minor in Business. He is currently a Project Manager for the Solar Car Team on campus. Additionally, he is running a start-up software company with friends. He thanked the Board for their support in realizing these opportunities. Ms. Jennifer Ojukwu is travelling overseas and therefore was unable to attend the Board meeting in person today. Ms. Ojukwu is a junior majoring in Biology (pre-med), serving as Vice President of the Pre-health Society and the Service Chair for Beta Psi Omega, a professional biology fraternity, interning at University Hospital.
- 4. BY A MOTION DULY MADE BY DR. DeCAPRIO, SECONDED BY MR. DAHMS AND UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED, with Mr. Toft abstaining, the Board voted to APPROVE RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE AWARD OF THE CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACT FOR THE CLEAN ROOM FACILITY CONSTRUCTION FOR MICROFLUIDICS SENSOR FABRICATION LABORATORY AND CELL AND GENE DEVELOPMENT CENTER.

- 5. BY A MOTION DULY MADE BY MR. DAHMS, SECONDED BY MR. RAIA AND UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED, the BOARD voted to APPROVE RESOLUTION OF NEW JERSEY INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY ("NJIT") TO APPROVE THE PURCHASE AND SALE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE FREDERICK MUELLER FAMILY LLC AND NJIT FOR THE ACQUISITION OF BLOCK 2828, LOTS 35, 37, BLOCK 372, LOTS 1, 5, 6, 9, 10, 11, 12, 14, 15, 16, 18, 22 and 24.
- 6. BY A MOTION DULY MADE BY MR. DAHMS, SECONDED BY MR. RAIA AND UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED, the Board voted to APPROVE RESOLUTION FOR THE ACQUISITION OF BLOCK 372, LOT 17, 317 DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. BOULEVARD, NEWARK, NEW JERSEY.
- 7. BY A MOTION DULY MADE BY MR. BONE, SECONDED BY MR. TOFT AND UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED, the Board voted to APPROVE RESOLUTION OF NEW JERSEY INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY ("NJIT") TO APPROVE THE FORWARD DELIVERY REFUNDING OF SERIES 2010H BONDS.
- 8. BY A MOTION DULY MADE BY MR. CISTARO, SECONDED BY MS. MONTALTO AND UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED, with MR. TOFT abstaining, the Board voted to APPROVE RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE RENEWARL OF STATUTORY WORKERS COMPENSATION AND EMPLOYERS LIABILITY INSURANCE.
- 9. Dr. Bloom gave his report to the Board. He referenced the Governor's Plan which was distributed in the Board materials, entitled "The State of Innovation: Building a Stronger and Fairer Economy in New Jersey. We will respond by January 1st, and assist the Governor in his plans to move forward, particularly with respect to preparing the workforce. Dr. Bloom also discussed NJIT's placement within US News & World Report 1200 top universities in the world. He updated the Board as to recent events on campus, including the MetroLab Conference that took place at NJIT last month. Including the attendance of mayors from cities across the country, as well as 2 governors and 18 college presidents/senior leaders.
- 10. Mr. Leonard Kaplan, Director of Athletics, gave a report to the Board of Trustees. He first discussed our Fall 2018 Student-Athlete Profile, which is strong. We have 206 in-state student athletes, and 134 out-of-state and international athletes. Their average SAT is 1274. Discussing selected academic achievements, he noted that the all-athlete average GPA is 3.291. 39 student-athletes had GPA's of 4.0, including 235 over 3.0 (70.4%). Ten teams were recognized as All-Academic by their national governing bodies, and three teams were recognized nationally by NCAA for ranking in the top 10% for academic progress rate. Mr. Kaplan discussed selected individual highlights for 2017-2018, and current year highlights, set forth on p. 39 of the Board materials. It was noted that NACDA named Mr. Kaplan Under Armour Athletic Director of the Year. Mr. Kaplan reviewed the athletic highlights of the past year, including the ribbon cutting for the WEC and the first game against Wagner. Mr.Bishof discussed the intercollegiate athletics budget including revenues and expenses (p. 42 of the Board materials). We manage the budgets closely; Mr. Bishof commended the Business and Assistant Business Managers. The athletics budget comprises 4% of the total budget for the

university. We supported 107 full time scholarships last year, and 108 this year, with average expenses of \$28,117, totaling \$28,500 per student athlete. Chair DePalma asked what our challenges are. Mr. Kaplan discussed the balancing issues faced by our student-athletes; the majors are not always easy. Engineering is a top 10 major, and we have to remember we are, as a university.

- 11. Dr. Atam Dhawan, Sr. Vice Provost for Research, gave a presentation on Research Growth Strategies, including a slide presentation. Our external academic research is flat for FY 2018, and faculty summer salary decreased, while graduate and undergraduate student support increased. This indicates a cultural transformation for a more student-centric university. Dr. Dhawan sends out a weekly newsletter alerting faculty to grant research opportunities. We are building teams to respond to NSF opportunities. Our cyber infrastructure is being reviewed, along with a possible collaboration with Rutgers. Dr. Dhawan discussed interdisciplinary institutes, focusing on the upcoming November 27<sup>th</sup> event. With regard to the proposed medical devices cluster, we are looking to repurpose the Microelectronics Fabrication Center. Dr. Dhawan also noted that four faculty are approved for enterprise development through companies.
- 12. Dr. Deek gave a report from the University Senate, which met this week, and there was a lively exchange of ideas. The faculty also have a seat on the University Senate. When we engage in shared governance, the university is at its best.
- 13. Vice President Alexo gave a FY 2019 Fundraising Update. We are trending ahead in all but one category. We have reached \$3 million in philanthropic commitments this year, and have 4 solicitations of \$1 million pending. On page 51 of the Board materials, there is a list of events, including tomorrow's November 9<sup>th</sup> Celebration event.
- 14. Treasurer Bishof gave a report of Operating Statement Year to Date, and Schedule of Short Term Investments. Referring to p. 56 of the Board materials, he noted that our budget of \$545 Million is on target. We've received 55% of tuition and fees for the year (Fall/Summer). We are engaging in an aggressive recruitment system, and improved cash collection on some of our grants. We received \$180 thousand more in our investment returns.
- 15. Vice President Christ discussed the Cleary Crime Data Report, on p. 64 of the Board materials. There are no significant changes from the last report. We've distributed the Safe & Sound brochures which were shared with the Board. The annual report is both printed and on-line.
- 16. Chair DePalma discussed the Schedule of 2018-2019 Trustee meetings; we will have the complete schedule for 2020 at our next Board meeting.
- 17. Chair DePalma also discussed the upcoming events, highlighting the Celebration event tomorrow evening, November 9<sup>th</sup>. At 10 a.m. in the morning on the 9<sup>th</sup>, there will be a ribbon-cutting event for the School of Applied Engineering and Technology at the Makerspace facility. The School currently has an enrollment of 1,000 and we are looking to double that.

18. The Chair announced that the next regularly scheduled Closed Session will be convened on Thursday, February 7, 2019 at 2 p.m. at Eberhardt Hall Alumni Center Board Room, to discuss personnel, real estate, legal and contractual matters. The following resolution was read and approved by all Trustees present:

RESOLUTION OF NEW JERSEY INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY ("NJIT") APPROVING A THREE-YEAR AGREEMENT WITH ELSEVIER B.V. AT A TOTAL OF \$1,323,244.26 FOR 2019-2021 FOR THE SCIENCEDIRECT ONLINE DATABASE

#### Background:

Electronic database subscriptions are a critical part of the scholarly communication ecosystem and vital to the educational and research efforts of NJIT. Electronic databases and journals subscriptions have continued to escalate in price due to the changing economics of publishing and to changes in scholarly communications.

NJIT Libraries has constantly pursued cost-effective means of providing resources that satisfy the research needs of users. This includes price negotiation with database vendors. Elsevier B.V. has offered NJIT a second three-year amendment (2019-2021) to the original contract, dated December 6, 2013, at a reduced cost of an average of 3.58% per annum over the first amendment for the period (2016-2018) which was at an average rate of 4.5% per annum.

The subscribed products and fees identified in the table below are for the period 2019-2021.

- WHEREAS, the New Jersey Institute of Technology approved the original Elsevier Subscription Agreement No. 1-5673073032 for the ScienceDirect Online subscription dated December 6, 2013, as last amended on November 14, 2016, and
- WHEREAS, the services of an electronic subscription vendor are necessary for the efficient operation of the Robert W. Van Houten Library and Barbara & Leonard Littman Architecture and Design Library, and
- WHEREAS, a team of reference and electronic resources librarians has consulted directly with all NJIT academic departments to renew, add, or cancel, necessary electronic subscriptions to support the NJIT curriculum and research, and
- WHEREAS, under the terms of the Second Amendment to Elsevier Subscription Agreement No. 1-5673073032, NJIT has the option of three one year renewals, with 2019 being the first renewal year, and
- WHEREAS, New Jersey Statutes Title 18A. (Section 18A:64-56 Exceptions) permit purchase, contract or agreement may be made, negotiated or awarded by the State college by resolution at a public meeting of its board of trustees without public advertising for bids or bidding and,
- WHEREAS, the cost of the electronic subscription and fees for the calendar year 2019 will not exceed \$422,855.47, and
- WHEREAS, the cost of the electronic subscription and fees for the calendar year 2020 will not exceed \$440,826.83, and
- WHEREAS, the cost of the electronic subscription and fees for the calendar year 2021 will not exceed \$459,561.96, and
- WHEREAS, the total cost of the electronic subscription for all three years will not exceed \$1,323,244.26, and the funds have been budgeted for this purpose.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the New Jersey Institute of Technology Board of Trustees hereby authorizes the administration to execute a guaranty of the subscription between the New Jersey Institute Technology and Elsevier B.V. based on the final terms and conditions of the subscription being negotiated between the parties.




#### New Jersey Institute of Technology Statement of Revenue & Expenditures FY2019 As of December 31, 2018

REVENUE DISTRIBUTION





EXPENSE DISTRIBUTION






### **EXPENDITURES BY PROGRAM**
