- VI. Report of the Faculty Senate President

President Denis Blackmore first welcomed the new senator from Physics, Alexander Kosovichev, then gave his report: Jersey City and questions on its financial health. Complaints of the Dean of Students Office regarding issues with students and grading. Have an Institute Faculty Meeting focused on faculty questions and input. Trying to get more faculty involved with faculty governance. Mentioned Ian Gatley's example of bringing thorny issues back to one's department/school for discussion.

VII. Presentation by Robert Cohen, Chair, Board of Trustees, followed by Q&A
Robert Cohen gave his presentation on the Board of Trustees. Short Term goals: looking
at the 2025 Plan and educating the Trustees in the plan. Long Term goals: Coming out of
the Pandemic. Going to have to look beyond New Jersey for students. Research and
Industry constantly changing. Prioritization of different infrastructures and money
spending. Presidential search: Aggressive search to find the right person. Have not gone
public and initiated the search process because there is no benefit for going early. Voted
on the timeline and no changes or deviations from the timeline. Q&A followed with
discussion.

VIII. Presentation by Andrew Christ, RDCO VP and Covid-19 Taskforce Director, followed by Q&A

Andrew Christ gave his presentation on the University's covid situation. Resumed on campus presence of faculty and staff and welcomed students back to campus. Pandemic Recovery Plan is flexible and comprehensive that allows for immediate shift online and modified operations in response to changing circumstances. Went over surveillance testing, outcomes of the Fall, and students' experiences with converged learning. Touched on the plan for Spring 2021: continue the same comprehensive flexible plan, academic calendar remains as published, monitor variables for operational changes get input from governmental entities and communicate important information in usual ways. Health and safety of students, faculty, and staff is first and foremost. Q&A followed.
