NJIT PTAC Tip of the Month:

Recovering From A Government Shutdown

The most recent government shutdown has hit some contractors hard. Even though the 35-day shutdown is over and federal employees are receiving their back pay, federal contractors are not. What can you do if you are a contractor who was adversely impacted by the shutdown? Here are a few suggestions.

- 1. If you have FAR Clause 52.242-15 (Stop Work Order) in your contract and the Contracting Officer issued a "stop work order" before the shutdown, you may be entitled to a request for equitable adjustment. If you need help in this area, have a conversation with your PTAC counselor and if necessary, work with an attorney versed in federal contract law.
- 2. Pay attention to the news. There are ongoing discussions by federal lawmakers whether or not to fund back pay for contractors affected by the shutdown. Although at this time the final decision is still in the air, you can <u>click here</u> for the latest news or conduct a web search for "federal contractor back pay" to get the most recent update.
- 3. If you are involved with an association that supports, advocates, and or lobbies on behalf of government contractors, connect with your association leaders and ask what efforts are underway to have your collective voices heard.
- 4. Talk with your local congressional representative's office. <u>Click here</u> to use the "find your representative" page at the House.Gov website. Enter your zip code, and when you get your result, click on the representative's name/hyperlink and it will bring you to their website where you can find contact information.
- 5. Plan for the future. FAR clause 52.242-15 is an optional clause that federal contracting officers may or may not include in your contract. If you are looking at a solicitation and don't see FAR clause 52.242-15, it will not make it into your contract unless you ask for it. Call or email the Procuring Contracting Officer and ask them to amend the solicitation to include this clause as it may protect you in the event of a future shutdown. If they are not willing to include FAR clause 52.242-15, you may consider not pursuing the opportunity or do so but have some contingency plans in place.

and invited into opportunities by federal buyers as well as prime contractors seeking to meet small business goals. Unfortunately, approximately 90% of SAM-registered small businesses have something wrong with their SBA Profile. A recent survey of small business profiles conducted on the SBA's Small Dynamic Search Database at dsbs.sba.gov showed that 60% of firms didn't even complete their capabilities narrative. The capabilities narrative is one of the first things that federal buyers and prime contractors see when they are searching for a small business. If your profile is missing information, you may be getting passed over on opportunities.

In addition to not having a capabilities narrative, other issues include missing keywords, an improperly formatted URL leading to the business website, left out performance history (references), and failure to indicate business type percentages, to name a few.
