## Trained Police Officers Provide Campus Safety

Concern about safety is a necessary fact of life for any university campus. NJIT, with more than 10,000 students, faculty and staff, is no different. Located in the midst of University Heights near downtown Newark, this urban campus offers a thriving, bustling environment that enjoys a very low crime rate.

The Department of Public Safety, located at 154 Summit Street on the first level of the Parking Deck, provides protection 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The 65-member department includes a Director of Public Safety, lieutenants, sergeants, police officers, public safety officers and an administrative support staff.

## Campus-Wide Notification System (CWNS)

The Campus-Wide Notification System (CWNS) allows NJIT to communicate important information on an expedited basis with students, faculty and staff via text message, phone and e-mail. The CWNS complements other communication channels such as broadcast e-mails, the NJIT website, postings across campus, and local media. The CWNS is used only for situations such as delayed openings or closings caused by weather or potential, imminent threats to the safety of the university community.

NJIT students, faculty and staff can opt to participate in the system by providing phone numbers and e-mail addresses to which the CWNS can send text messages, voicemail and e-mail. All contact info in the CWNS is confidential and will not be shared with other NJIT offices or third parties, except when responding to an emergency. Only the Department of Public Safety can initiate campus-wide notifications. ## Dial 973-596-3111 for Emergencies on Campus

Special emergency telephones connected directly to the university police dispatcher are located throughout the 45-acre campus in buildings and parking lots and at fraternity and sorority houses.

Use these special no-dial telephones for direct access or dial ext. 3111 from campus telephones or 973-596-3111 from cell phones — to report a crime, suspicious activity or other emergencies. The caller should provide:

- The location of the incident.

- His or her identity.
  - The nature of the incident.
  - The type of assistance needed, such as police, ambulance or fire department.
- In a medical emergency, do no more for the victim than your qualifications and experience allow.
- In the event of a fire, call for help and spread the alarm while evacuating.
- In reporting a crime, be prepared to provide as much information as

- possible including:
- A physical description of the suspect.
  - The direction in which the suspect fled.
  - A description of the suspect's vehicle, if known.
- Do not disturb the crime scene under any circumstances.
- For additional information about crime incidents and safety concerns, check the student newspaper or the Department of Public Safety's website, where you will also find numerous safety tips.

## Security Systems Department Automates Safety Measures

The Security Systems, Photo Identification & Parking Services Department is located at 131 Summit Street (at the corner of Summit Street and Warren Street). The department is responsible for the following services:

- Campus-Wide Notification System
- Building & Office Alarms
- Photo ID Cards & Access
- Police Radios
- CCTV Cameras
- Intercoms & Emergency Phones
- Parking Registration
- Parking Violations & Appeals
- Visitor Parking

Security Systems assists the Department of Public Safety in its mission to effectively protect NJIT faculty, staff, students and property. Building and office alarms report back to police dispatch within seconds of an event. Card access readers, located throughout the campus, allow authorized individuals to enter and exit buildings after hours.

The police dispatchers use closed-circuit television cameras to monitor campus activity by performing video tours of the campus. The CCTV system is also used to investigate incidents and to efficiently dispatch personnel.

Police radios allow officers to remain in continuous contact with each other and Headquarters. Intercoms and emergency phones allow individuals to communicate with the Department of Public Safety from locations throughout campus. The identification system generates photo IDs that allow the Department of Public Safety to identify students, faculty and staff. Parking systems register and store vehicle information for on-campus parking.

These systems assist the Department of Public Safety in monitoring and protecting the campus from theft and personal injury. Although the systems are highly automated, the entire university community must participate in reporting any suspicious activity.

**Business Hours:** The Security Systems, Photo Identification & Parking Services Department hours are posted each semester. Normal office hours are Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Photo identification cards are issued Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. and 1 to 4 p.m. To accommodate the high demand associated with the start of each semester, office hours are extended Monday through Thursday until 6 p.m. for the first two weeks of each term. ## NJIT Photo ID Cards: Getting To Know Your NJIT Photo ID Card

All new faculty, staff and students are issued their first NJIT photo ID card free of charge. This identification card must be updated with the current term's validation sticker. Students can validate their cards each semester by reporting to the Security Systems, Photo Identification & Parking Services Department or the Van Houten Library after they have registered for classes. Faculty and staff must validate their cards at the start of each calendar year by reporting to the Security Systems, Photo Identification & Parking Services Department or the Office of Human Resources. Once validated, NJIT photo ID cards serve many functions.

**Identification purposes:** Photo ID cards must be carried at all times while you are on campus. Public safety officers may request that you present your identification card to validate your authorized presence on campus at any time.

**Parking lot access:** Upon registering for a campus parking permit, the magnetic stripe on the back of your photo ID card is activated to operate gate arms at designated parking lots. Card holders can swipe their ID cards at parking lot entrance card readers (such as the parking deck) to gain access to parking.

**Card access:** Some campus perimeter doors, such as the doors on Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard leading to the Student Mall, the parking deck, Fenster Hall and Weston Hall; and the Central Avenue quad doors leading to the Gutenberg Information Technologies Center and the Mechanical Engineering building require an NJIT Photo ID card to be swiped for both entering and exiting the buildings at all times. This process greatly enhances security in these perimeter areas.

**After business hours ID access:** If authorized by a department chairperson or director, NJIT photo ID cards can be activated to allow after-hour access to certain buildings. By swiping the card, you can enter and exit buildings without assistance from the Department of Public Safety.

**Other functions:** Other functions of the NJIT photo ID card include shuttle bus use, library services, dining services meal plans, gym access, laboratory equipment usage, and special event admittance.

Should your photo identification card be lost or stolen, please report the incident to the Security Systems, Photo Identification & Parking Services Department immediately. Once we have

been notified, your photo ID card will be marked invalid and deactivated for use. After paying for a new photo ID card which may be purchased at the NJIT Bursar's Office, please bring the receipt of payment to the Security Systems, Photo Identification & Parking Services Department for issuance of a replacement photo ID card.

As we expand the usage of the NJIT photo ID, there is much added responsibility that you must take while it is in your possession. Photo ID cards are not to be transferred to anyone for any reason. By lending your card to others, you are compromising the functionality and privileges that the card provides you. # Campus Safety Tips

In the event of an emergency or any suspicious activity, contact the NJIT Department of Public Safety at 973-596-3111. For all non-emergency requests, call 973-596-3120 or 973-596-3116.

These safety tips from the Department of Public Safety will help keep you safe.

- Immediately notify campus police of suspicious activity.
- Avoid carrying wallets and valuables in backpacks.
- Have a friend accompany you when walking off-campus after dark.
- Consider using the Department of Public Safety's Security Escort Service.
- Use the NJIT ATM machines, located at the Department of Public Safety, 154 Summit Street, or at the Campus

- Center instead of walking off campus.
- Avoid carrying large sums of money.
- Individuals under the influence of drugs and alcohol are more likely to be victims of a serious crime.
- Know where the emergency phones are located throughout campus.
- Walk through the NJIT and Rutgers-Newark campuses, instead of around them.
- Park vehicles in NJIT lots instead of off-campus on city streets.
- Lock and secure parked vehicles and remove valuable items.
- Keep all security doors shut. Do not prop open security or fire doors.
- Lock doors to your residence at all times.
- Never lend a residence key to anyone who doesn't live with you.

- Never leave property unattended or unsecured, even for a few moments.
  - Never leave any PIN numbers for credit cards or ATM cards in your wallet or purse.
  - Photocopy the identity page, any visa pages and I-94 form in your passport and keep them in a separate place.
- The NJIT Department of Public Safety asks that you be alert and attentive to your surroundings. Always notify the department of any suspicious activity. Remember that you are responsible for your safety and security. Be street smart, think smart and be aware of your surroundings at all times.

## Campus Parking – [www.njit.edu/parking](http://www.njit.edu/parking)



Vehicles must be registered with the Security Systems, Photo Identification & Parking Services Department and display a current NJIT permit to park in campus lots. Students can register their vehicles by logging into [www.njit.edu/parking](http://www.njit.edu/parking) and choosing the on-line link to an automated parking registration system. Faculty and staff can register for parking by mail or in person before the start of each semester.

Certain lots and/or spaces are designated for specific usage such as student, faculty/staff or reserved parking. Please follow the posted lot signs and their instructions. To help prevent crime and to increase public safety, all parking lots, except for the deck, close at 10:45 p.m.

NJIT public safety officers permanently staff perimeter lots 7, 10, 12 and 18 (when open). Other lots, including Fenster Hall Levels 1 & 2, lot 16, lot 16A and the main parking deck, have NJIT photo ID card activated gates that prevent access to unauthorized vehicles.

Lots 5, 7, 10, 16, 16A, Fenster Hall Levels 1 & 2, and the parking deck are monitored by closed circuit television cameras. NJIT officers patrol all lots by bicycle, scooters and vehicles on a regular basis. These patrols protect persons and property, prevent crime and enforce parking regulations.

A system for determining parking space availability for the main parking garage and Fenster Hall parking level 2 is in operation. The system illuminates a red lot FULL sign at the entrance gates when no parking spaces are available. A green lot OPEN sign is illuminated when parking space is available.

A dial-in telephone feature is available on the system. Dial 973-596-5610 to hear a system message on available parking spaces at these two locations. There are four connections available for this phone number at any given time. If you should receive a busy signal, please try again.

## Preventing Identity Theft

Identity theft occurs when your personal information is stolen and used without your knowledge to commit fraud. Identity theft can cost you time, money and destroy your credit.

Deter identity thieves by safeguarding your information.

- **Shred** financial documents and paperwork with personal information before you discard them.
- **Protect** your Social Security number. Don't carry your Social Security card in your wallet or write your Social Security number on a check. Give it out only if absolutely necessary or ask to use another identifier. Use NJIT student or employee ID number where possible.
- **Don't give out** personal information on the phone, through the mail, or

over the Internet unless you know who you are dealing with.

- **Never click** on links sent in unsolicited emails; instead, type in a web address you know. Use firewalls, anti-spyware, and anti-virus software to protect your home computer; keep them up-to-date. Visit [OnGuardOnline.gov](http://OnGuardOnline.gov) for more information.
- **Don't use** an obvious password like your birth date, your mother's maiden name, or the last four digits of your Social Security number.
- **Keep** your personal information in a secure place at home, especially if you have roommates, employ outside help, or are having work done in your house.

# Campus Housing: What You Should Know

Living in campus housing can be one of the most enjoyable aspects of the college experience. Campus housing provides an environment that fosters the academic and personal growth that helps students prepare for the rest of their lives.

The director of residence life is responsible for the over 1,600 student campus residents and for the overall operation of the campus housing system. Residence coordinator offices are located on the first floors of Cypress (973-596-5403), Laurel (973-642-7271), Oak (973-596-5653) and Redwood (973-596-5414) Halls, with office hours Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m. Students also live at the University Centre, with office hours Monday through Friday, 9 a.m.-6 p.m. (973-504-8200). The addresses and phone numbers of the campus housing desks are:

In an emergency, assistance can be obtained by contacting the front desk of each residence hall, the University Centre or the Department of Public Safety. Each of the four residence halls as well as the University Centre is staffed with a professional residence hall coordinator and resident assistants.

Desk attendants provides security for campus housing by monitoring the entrance. When a guest arrives, a desk attendant notifies the resident who is required to come to the lobby and meet the guest. Guests age 15 and younger must be accompanied by an adult and are not permitted to stay overnight without permission of the residence coordinator. Guests are also not allowed in campus housing without a host.

Residents must show valid NJIT resi-

dent identification to gain entrance to the building. Both desk attendants and electronic access card readers located at entrances strictly enforce that policy. Guests are permitted with identification, but may not stay in campus housing more than two nights a week. To sign into campus housing, guests must provide one of the following, which will be retained at the desk until the guest departs:

- A valid NJIT ID (with a current semester sticker and/or a campus housing sticker).
- A valid driver's license (or state-issued photo)

Visitors without a driver's license or school ID may display a passport or green card. These forms of ID should not be left at the front desk.

For reasons of health, safety and maintenance, authorized university officials reserve the right to enter a student's room. Entries are conducted at reasonable hours, except in emergencies. Room searches by professional staff and police

officers are conducted only with the approval of the Dean of Student Services or if a legal search warrant is obtained. Objects of the search and prohibited items can be removed. Items that are legally possessed, but not permitted in campus housing, are returned to the student for removal from campus. Illegal items are confiscated.

All students are strongly urged to safeguard their campus housing keys and combinations. All thefts must be reported to the campus housing staff and the Department of Public Safety. Rooms should be kept locked at all times. The university is not responsible for the loss of personal property and equipment, such as televisions and computers. Students are encouraged to have either renter's or homeowner's insurance.

# Counseling and Psychological Services Available for Students, Faculty and Staff

## Services for Students

NJIT Counseling and Psychological Services (C-CAPS) is available to help NJIT students with the transitions and stresses of college life as well as with more serious psychological problems or crises. Professional counselors and psychologists help students explore available options, increase their self-awareness and make realistic decisions. Counseling around issues like self-esteem, relationships, depression or anxiety can reduce stress, improve academic performance and enhance

the quality of the college experience. Specialized services are also available for students struggling with substance abuse issues. When appropriate, assessment tests or psychiatric evaluation for medication may be recommended to supplement counseling services. Referrals to off-campus professionals and/or 12-step programs may also be provided based on students' needs or preferences.

Student counseling and psychological services are confidential and client information remains within the C-CAPS, in accordance with legal and ethical professional guidelines. Students are encouraged to contact the C-CAPS for an

appointment by calling 973-596-3414 or going to 205 Campbell Hall. Additional information is available on the C-CAPS website at [www.counseling.njit.edu](http://www.counseling.njit.edu).

In addition to offering counseling and psychological services, the university offers workshops and other awareness programs for the campus community. These may be coordinated by different student services departments including Campus Center/Wellness Programming, Student Health Services or the C-CAPS. Examples include depression/ anxiety disorder awareness and screening, alcohol abuse screening and prevention programming, eating disorder awareness,

stress reduction, and workshops on managing test anxiety and reducing procrastination.

## Services for Faculty and Staff

The Employee Assistance Program (EAP) provides confidential counseling and referral services for university employees (additional information is available on the NJIT website at [www.njit.edu/eap](http://www.njit.edu/eap)).
