Security Systems, Photo ID and Parking Services

he Facility Systems, Photo Identification and Parking Services Department is located at 131 Summit Street and is responsible for the following services:

Public Safety Accreditation/Campus Safety Recognition Awards

n June of 2017, the Department of Public Safety was awarded full accredited status by the New Jersey Law Enforcement Accreditation Commission (NJLEAC), recognizing best practices in all major aspects of law enforcement. Since that time, the department has continued to be innovative and, as a direct result of crime prevention and community policing/outreach efforts, great strides have been achieved to ensure the highest level of safety for the entire community. All of the department's accomplishments and initiatives, including but not limited to 9-1-1 and Traffic Safety

Division, have resulted in greater recognition of the campus and notable Campus Safety Awards. We are currently ranked 6th out of 4.706 eligible universities for our overall initiatives by "Safe Campus" National Campus Safety Summit, and the only college in New Jersey recognized in 2018. This is the third year in a row that NJIT was ranked in the top 25, with the highest ranking this year at number six. These accomplishments would not have been possible without the unwavering support of students, faculty, staff and senior administration.

NJIT Department of Public Safety: Mission Statement

he mission of the NJIT Police Department is to provide the community and visitors with the highest quality of law enforcement services. We continually improve the public's perception of community safety through eradication of criminal activity and any conditions that have a detrimental impact on public safety. The department will accomplish this task while using the Community Oriented Policing and Problem Solving (C.O.P.P.S.) model.

Providing this service to the public will be conducted in an efficient and effective manner, consistent with statutory authority, available budgeted resources and professional skills. The department recognizes its members as its most valuable resource, and will strive to maintain the quality of public service through committed leadership, supervisory direction, career development, succession planning and training.

Campus-Wide Notification System (CWNS)

The Campus-Wide Notification System (CWNS-Send Word Now) allows NJIT to communicate important information on an expedited basis to students, faculty and staff via text message, phone and email. The CWNS complements other communication channels, such as broadcast emails, the NJIT website, postings across campus, and local media. The CWNS is used only for major disruptions such as delayed openings or closings caused by weather or imminent threats to the safety of the university community.

NJIT students, faculty and staff can opt to participate in the system by providing phone numbers and email addresses to which the CWNS can send text messages, voicemail and email. All

n November of 2018, The Department of Public Safety launched its EMT/CSO pilot program.

The program consists of two distinct groups of student volunteers who serve in the capacity of either an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) or a Community Service Officer (CSO). Primarily each group is tasked with different objectives, although in a narrow scope, some may overlap, that focus on augmenting and bolstering community relations between the department and the university community by providing valuable volunteer services aimed at delivering quality customer service. All students selected shifts on a volunteer basis.

Student EMT's are a university sanctioned and recognized club by the Student Senate who have collectively drafted and adopted applicable bylaws of governance and funding. Student EMT's are first responders in the instance of a medical emergency such as a motor vehicle accident, criminal violence, natural disasters and any incident requiring possible medical assessment or attention. All volunteers are

trained and certified EMT's and were selected through a recruitment and interview process with specific parameters and requirements. Student EMT's also attended special events such as Open House and Career Day.

Student Community Service Officers (CSO's) are also part of the same university sanctioned and recognized club by the Student Senate. Student CSO's are uniformed and unarmed and volunteer under supervision of the Department of Public Safety and internal Command Staff. They serve and act in the capacity of the "eyes and ears" of the department and ambassadors of NJIT as an integral part of a collaborative effort to provide high levels of safety. Student CSO's also assisted at special events and disseminated pertinent and critical information to students, faculty, staff and guests.

The academic year closed with more than 25 members participating in the program, which will again commence in September with continued recruitment.

Community Policing/Social Distancing "New Normal"

As we move to our "New Normal" in response to COVID-19, the NJIT
Department of Public Safety has created innovative and alternative ways to safely and responsibly maintain social connections with the university community. The department's current Community Policing Unit has been expanded and is comprised of eight (8)
Divisions: Student Life, Residence Life, A.L.I.C.E., FEMA, Greek Life, Newark
Neighbors, Detective Bureau and a Traffic Unit. Each has a Division Leader and 8 to 10 officers under the guidance and direction of two (2)
Area Commanders.

Through collaborative and coordinated efforts, each division is responsible for developing and implementing community oriented programs to be shared with and delivered to the university community. The existing library of presentations, campaigns and training modules currently available is being expanded to include: web based meetings, the implementation of digital presentations and trainings, teleconferencing informative sessions and increased social media connections, all of which will be available to the entire university community. These enhanced initiatives will initially be implemented until In-Person and Hands-On interaction can safely resume. Faculty, Staff and

Students are encouraged to interact with officers to continuously develop and promote new ideas that enhance public safety, foster partnerships and provide valuable information and training for the public.

Community Policing Liaison Officers are assigned to student organizations and key areas on campus to maintain contact and continuous and productive dialogue. Along with providing presentations and conducting training on campus in the tenets of safety awareness, the Community Policing Unit also has established and maintains contact and a relationship with surrounding communities through its Newark Neighbors Initiative. This includes the Historic James Street Association, the Newark Downtown District and also provides a viable platform and venue for recruitment.

Junior Police Academy

The goal of the Junior Police Academy is to establish a community outreach initiative that will educate children on the fundamentals of joining a police academy (In a modified capacity), to help strengthen the foundation of core values, discipline, and teamwork as part of the Greater Newark Community Initiative. Applications and waivers were created and vetted through the office of Risk Management and when approved, were disseminated to local area schools for purposes of recruitment for the program.

The local Newark Community Middle Schools that were visited include, The Northstar Academy, Sussex Avenue School, University Heights, Salome Urena and the First Avenue School. Officers met with the principals and educational leaders at each school and provided them with applications and flyers for distribution and promotion of the program. Eight students participated in the pilot one week program to foster community connec-

tions and interaction within the Newark community surrounding area.

Field trips included the Newark Fire Department and Metlife Stadium and surrounding agencies provided demonstrations including K-9 protocol. The class was held in the NJIT Wellness and Events Center from July 29 through August 2, 2019 with the graduation ceremony on August 5, 2019.

Campus Housing: What You Should Know

iving in campus housing can be one of the most enjoyable aspects of the college experience. Campus housing provides an environment that fosters the academic and personal growth that helps students prepare for the rest of their lives.

Building offices are located on the first floors of Cypress (973-596-5403), Laurel (973-642-7271), Redwood (973-596-5414) and Oak Hall (973-596-5653), the second floor of the Honors Hall (973-596-5527) and the Greek Village on the first floor of the Honors Hall, Room 117 (973-596-5511). Each building is staffed with a professional residencehall coordinator or a graduate residence coordinator and residence assistants.

Residents must show valid NJIT resident identification to gain entrance to their building. Both desk attendants and electronic access card readers located at entrances strictly enforce this policy.

For reasons of health, safety and maintenance, authorized university officials reserve the right to enter a student's room. Entries are conducted at reasonable hours, except in emergencies. Room searches by professional staff and police officers are conducted only with the approval of the Dean of Students and Campus Life or if a legal search warrant is obtained. Objects of the search and prohibited items can be removed. Items that are legally possessed, but not permitted in campus

housing, are returned to the student for removal from campus. Illegal items are confiscated.

All students are strongly urged to safeguard their campus-housing keys and combinations. All thefts must be reported to the campus-housing staff and the Department of Public Safety. Rooms should be kept locked at all times. The university is not responsible for the loss of personal property and equipment, such as televisions and computers. Students are encouraged to have either renter's or homeowner's insurance.



Counseling and Psychological Services Available for Students, Faculty and Staff

Services for Students

JIT's Center for Counseling and Psychological Services (C-CAPS) is available to help NJIT students with the transitions and stresses of college life as well as with more serious psychological problems or crises. Professional counselors and psychologists help students increase self-awareness, develop coping skills, explore available options, and make realistic decisions. Psychological counseling around issues such as self-esteem, depression, anxiety, relationship or family issues, and substance use can reduce stress, improve academic performance and enhance the quality of the college experience. When appropriate, assessment tests or psychiatric evaluation for medication may be recommended to supplement psychological counseling services. Referrals to off-campus professionals and/or 12-step programs may also be provided based on students' needs or preferences. C-CAPS also provides group counseling services and conducts workshops and awareness programming for the campus community on topics such as anxiety, depression, stress management, substance abuse and other addictions, LGBTQIA+ issues, etc. In accordance with legal and ethical guidelines, student counseling and psychological services are confidential and student-client information remains within the C-CAPS, with certain mandated exceptions.
