



South Knoxville Waterfront



2008: Applied for EPA Brownfields Grants (petroleum and hazardous substance assessments)

2009: Awarded \$400,000 for both types of assessments

What was done:

- Conducted an inventory to identify sites
- Community outreach –
 Newsletter, media releases
 & coordination with
 property owners
- Selected 12 properties for further environmental assessment



Former Baptist Hospital, Knoxville

- ✓ 23 acre site
- ✓ Vacant since 2008
- ✓ Phase I and Phase II Assessments:
 - 6 Phase I reports (there were 6 parcels)
 - 3 Phase II reports
 - Lead based paint & asbestos surveying
 - Some parcels entered into the VOAP
 - Developer purchased property. Soon to be.....

Brownfields Voluntary Program

AKA: The VOAP

(Voluntary Cleanup, Oversight and Assistance Program)...

or the Voluntary Program...

or the Voluntary Brownfields Program.



VOAP

State Program

Allows contaminated properties to return

to safe re-use

Provides liability protection







VOAP Process

- 1. Apply to enter the Program
- 2. Perform Environmental Assessments
- 3. Negotiate a Brownfields Voluntary Agreement
- 4. Complete requirements:
 - public notice
 - actions agreed upon in the Voluntary Agreement
- 5. Receive a letter of concurrence





Founder's Park, Johnson City

Property: Former Young's Warehouse property

Historic uses: Gas station, tire retreading facility, bulk petroleum storage, and a drycleaner





Founder's Park, Johnson City

Intent: Provide relief for flooding and greenspace in downtown Johnson City

• Today:

5-acre greenway and park along the new creek bank with a 200-seat amphitheater for outdoor and educational activities


