ENROLLMENT AND ACADEMICS (2007-2008)

- Total enrollment: 8,288 (5,428 undergraduate, 2,860 graduate)
- Some 1,500 students live on campus in five residence halls.
- 96 degree programs – 36 bachelor's, 41 master's, 19 doctoral

FACULTY

- 391 full-time faculty
- 89% hold doctoral degrees, and 98% have the highest degree attainable in their field
- The student-faculty ratio is 13:1
