- A. Ad Hoc Task Force on Federal Actions Johanna Deane 10/13 meeting
 - 1. Subcommittees are refining and modifying their charges
 - 2. SWAT analysis of what is likely to occur over the next few years

- 3. DEI subcommittee commissioned a student survey over the summer. Much higher than usual feedback for a summer survey (3x)
- 4. Compact documents are a blueprint for what the federal government is looking for and provide us with ideas
- B. **UCAN** Scott Kent New president and new union representative. Negotiations for the new contract will begin in January; the current contract expires on June 30.
- C. CFRR Ryan Tolboom/Jose Alcala has been meeting every Monday, mostly working on the language of the Teaching Faculty proposal. Has been meeting with various administrators and stakeholders. Moving forward, but needs to be kept consistent with various contracts, etc.
- D. Faculty Senate Jaskirat Sodhi / Ryan Tolboom Faculty Senate passed a motion to table indefinitely the motion on the New Jersey Mutual Defense Resolution.
 - Increased Undergrad enrollment, the PhD is solid, but the Master's programs are dropping off dramatically because of losing international enrollment, with a significant impact on our budget. Students from India and China, esp. in Computer, students from India on Visas.
 - Project Spark transition from Banner to Workday is underway.

Discussion of the Institute Faculty Meeting. The government shutdown affects research. Task force looking at the impact. Visa pause in effect. Trump compact for higher education is now available to all institutions.

Al microcredentials are now up in Canvas.

We have a large number of applications, but the yield is falling off. 66-67% acceptance race. High school grades are back down to the level of 2020. David Fisher commented that a larger number of students are putting down multiple deposits. Ideas about differential pricing. Discussion of other universities' strategies: Stevens will be free under a certain family income; Kean is giving out of state students in-state tuition.
