The mission of the Albert Dorman Honors College is to offer excellent students a superior academic program, hands-on research activities, and projects in order to prepare them to be leaders in their fields.

Honors College Advantages:

- Receive an Honors Merit Scholarship of **\$4,000** per year, with the possibility of additional merit-based scholarships.
- Out-of-state transfer students also receive the Presidential Scholarship (covers out-of-state surcharge) for a total scholarship package of over **\$10,000** per year.
- You may be eligible to apply to our accelerated medical, dental, optometry, and law programs.
- Each semester enroll in at least one enriched Honors section that features small, interactive classes.
- Attend your choice of two or more Honors Colloquia each term, at which speakers and panels discuss current scientific and social issues of the day.
- Relax in our well-equipped Resource Center, which includes the Honors Recreational Lounge, Study Lounge, and Computer Lab.
- Work closely with faculty and staff on research or industry-based projects.
- Receive an Honors Diploma upon graduation.
- Receive personal support and an Honors College academic advisor.

Honors College Requirements:

- 3.4 minimum cumulative GPA;
- Have completed 15 or more credits each semester;
- Currently taking no courses numbered below 100;
- Have participated in university or community activities, research, or service; and
- Have at least two full years remaining before graduating.
